

4) How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 203 responses




6) Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers 203 responses




How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 127 responses




6) Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 127 responses




How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 189 responses




Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? responses


