Abstract:

The behavioral sciences are the scientific disciplines that use observational and experimental methods to study human behavior and its underlying mechanisms. These sciences place emphasis on theory-driven research and a search for general principles of behavior, and recognize the roles of context, biology, learning and development, individual variation, socio-demographic variables, environment, religions and culture as determinants of behavior. Behavioral Science is the study of human behavior from a number of different subject (discipline) areas. Research in the behavioral sciences has consistently revealed that human behavior is complex, malleable, and variable. Both basic and applied research also reveals that, the determinants of behavior are not always "intuitive". and that theory can be applied successfully to alter human behavior. The goal of coursework in the behavioral sciences, as it applies to the general education core, is to provide faculty a foundation in the knowledge, process, function and values. The disciplines which contribute to an understanding of human behavior are psychology, sociology, politics, economics, history, law, philosophy and religion.

As engineering has a decisive impact on the development of the society, so faculty members in engineering discipline are required to take ethical components into consideration in relation to their students. The aim of this FDP is to recognize the rate of professional ethics components used by these faculty members in education. Ethics is a necessity need in every profession, it should be taken into account in employing people and in work environments. Due to the high impact of educational environments on the future of students and because of their critical duties in rendering education and making communities more developed, the importance of recognizing and observing professional ethics in these environments is a need of an hour.

Service to the society through extension activities

Best Practice -1: "Development of social responsibility among the students"

Objective of the practice:

The syllabus of Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati under choice based credit system (CBCS), the subject/ course introduced at entry level i. e. at First Year B. E. are quite application oriented. In view of Mission & Vision of this institute, to developed the social responsibility among the students for service to the downtrodden living in rural areas, department of Engg. Chemistry established an extension counter. Under this extension counter water quality, food quality testing and some parameters of soil testing carried out by the students and faculty. The reagents and facilities required for such testing are easily available in Engg. Chemistry lab. The students estimate the water quality parameter in their regular lab session. The first-year engineering department took this advantage of man power and facilities available in department and applied the knowledge gained by the students for testing quality water, food and soil.

Need addressed & Context:

For service to the society, department of Engineering Chemistry opened an extension counter to provide such testing facility to the peoples of nearby villages in the vicinity of this institute in the year 2021-22 under the guidance of Principal Dr. S. K. Deshmukh . The counter was inaugurated by Dr. P. V. Thorat (Officiating Principal) & Dr. S. K. Patil (IQAC coordinator) on the occasion of *National Science Day, 28th Feb. 2022*. Department of Engg. Chemistry organized practice session / workshop to give training to the first year students, how to test the quality of water, food & soil in laboratory. The villagers living in vicinity of this institute are using water for potable purpose from sources available in their villages such as well, tube well etc. and it is not safe for their health. They do not aware about the quality of water, hence there was a need to aware them and provide service of testing without charging any service fees.

The Practice:

Department of First year Engineering organized meeting with students and guided them about the testing of water quality as per Indian slandered, adulteration in food and also some parameter of soil such as moisture, pH, NPK

etc. The students used all the chemicals and equipment available in laboratory for testing samples, deposited by villagers using slandered procedure under the guidance of Dr. V. T. Bhugul & Dr. Mrs. J. V. Shegokar and prepare the report. In such practices teachers of allied department & NSS volunteers were also involved.

Evidence of success:

Most of the students admitted in this institute are from rural areas, there is no water testing facilities available in their villages. Students were appealed the villagers to take advantages of these testing facilities. The villagers brought samples for testing, we received very good response among the villagers from Bhabhulgaon, Dongargaon, Kumbhari, Sisa-Masa, Vizora etc. During mentoring and parent meet we came to know that, the villagers and parents of students are very much satisfied about this service given by this institute to the society and we the faculty and students also satisfied to fill full moto "Service to the downtrodden through education" of shri Shivaji education society Amravati.




Muramba is a Village in Murtijapur Taluka in Akola District of Maharashtra State, India.



Consultancy

The consultancy provided by a institute is both the source of its revenue generation and way to serve the society. Consultancy provided by institute is a benchmark for some agencies.
